



Bible Study ~ Line on Line

Isaiah 28:9-13 Whom shall he teach knowledge? and whom shall he make to understand doctrine; them that are weaned from the milk, and drawn from the breasts. 10 For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little:

This information is provided to help study the Bible line by line, verse by verse with spiritual understanding. These classes are not intended to make someone believe a doctrine, but to present spiritual understanding to the scriptures. The King James Version (KJV) of the Bible is the Bible translation used for the teaching. If you use another Bible Translation, you may keep it handy, however for best results in following the concepts taught, a KJV should be used during study.

To begin study:

1. **Select the New Testament book you wish to study.** Recommendations for first books to study are Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, James, or 1st John.
2. **Open and print a hard color copy of the book you have selected.** This color-coded copy will allow you to follow along and make notes as you study. Words in the King James Version of the Bible are underlined, connecting to other scripture references (called tie-ins) and notes in the margin. References to other scriptures throughout the teaching will help tie-in other related scriptures and show the consistent understanding throughout the Bible. Tie-ins clarify and support the understanding presented. The coloring helps identify ideas or people.
3. **Download Audio.** The Audio teachings for each book are in MP3 format. These files can be heard on computers, ipods, mp3 players, and CD players that have mp3 capability. Once downloaded, files can be burned onto CDs. For help in transferring files to your device of choice, please click [AUDIO HELP](#).
4. **Study.** The teacher reads the verse being studied and gives basic understanding. Then the tie-in(s) will be read, pointing out the connection with any underlined words in the verse. In a "live" class setting, after the teacher has taught a series of verses, the student is free to ask questions pertaining to the ideas conveyed in those verses. It is best to finish listening to a line of thought before formulating questions. Students studying by listening to the audio recordings should note questions and then contact the email address provided below. Students may find it helpful to take pencil notes.
